THE FUTURE OF THE BRIGHTON WORLD FAMOUS WEST PIER IS TO BE DECIDED IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS.

The latest proposal is for an American style amusement park to be developed on the landward end immediately opposite Regency Square. The park, described as a Victorian Disneyland, would be dominated by a 150 ft high ferris wheel.

The scheme is the brainchild of Alan Hawes whose firm, Metrim Engineering, has already installed similar fairs elsewhere. Mr Hawes is prepared! to put up the £6 million or so needed to restore the whole pier and build the fun fair.

An idea like this couldn't have come at a better time for the ailing West Pier campaign. The campaign has been torn by internal disputes for about eighteen months and the annual accounts of the company set up to buy the Pier, show it to be over £10,000 in the red.

Mr Hawes' first step will be to apply for planning permission to build his fun fair on the Pier. How will the Council react? Initial signs are that they are interested in the idea.

But a key factor must be the views of the residents and traders in the area. Opinions vary. Supporters of the scheme welcome it as the only chance to save the Pier; they point out that it will be in keeping with Brighton's image as a lively seaside resort.

Others object, saying they would rather see the Pier go than have it spoilt by a huge structure higher than the buildings opposite. They are also worried about the noise from the crowds riding on the wheel and other amusements.


What view shouls the Society adopt? If there is a clear majority amongst local people either for or against the scheme then the Society can present our views to the Council.
