

Movies on the Menu

You may know that the Burgher King restaurant in North Street used to be a cinema. In fact the screen is still there.

But did you also know that the Regency Restaurant in Regency Square was the venue for the first ever moving picture show in Brighton? Well, to be quite honest, no one really knows if that is the case. But the first recorded moving picture performance certainly took place in a public hall near Regency Square. The exact location is not known for certain but the Regency Restaurant in the south west corner is the most likely candidate.

This was just one of the interesting bits of information presented by John Roles in his talk at the AGM. He took us for a trip round many of the theatres and cinemas in central Brighton past and pleasant, and evoked some memories on the way.

Bins, Bikes and Fitness

The Council has given planning permission for the Fitness Factory in Castle Street to expand its operations onto the ground floor.

However, in response to requests from local residents and the Society, they have imposed two conditions. Off street parking must be provided for 8 bicycles and a rubbish storage area must also be provided on the premises.

Keeping the Public Informed

Brighton Council makes a great thing about the importance of keeping people informed about their activities. They even publish their own newspaper.

But when it comes to planning applications they are not quite as informative as they might be.

The society made written comments on the planning application for the Fitness Factory (see previous story). So once a decision had been made by the Planning Committee we received a letter back telling us what the decision was, namely "approved with conditions".

But what were the conditions? The letter didn't say. You have to phone or make a visit to the Planning Office to find that out.

When is a Reply not a Reply?

When it's a carefully worded response. Which is what we received from the Council after making a formal complaint about the way they had dealt with the planning application to extend the opening hours of the snooker club in Castle Street.

The Society committee has not yet had an opportunity to examine the response in detail but first impressions are that it does not really deal with the complaints.

We now have to decide whether to take the matter further by referring it to the Local Government Ombudsman.

Privatising the Railway

We have been sent a number of copies of a leaflet which explains briefly how privatisation will affect this area. It also tells you how to make comments on the plans if you want to do so. If you want a copy call Roger Hinton (321794).

Cable is Coming

Work will be underway to cable Regency Square and Queensbury Mews in May and June. Most of the cables will be located under the street rather than the pavement. Two distribution boxes will be needed, one at the north east corner of the Square, inside the railings, and the other on the east wall of the French Church in the Mews.

A number of streets in the area are being cabled this summer. The whole project is due for completion in September and the full cable service should be available once it is finished.
