Time to get Ratty with the Council!

The streets of Brighton are permanently littered with bags of rubbish. Seagulls and animals attack them and leave rotting food strewn across the pavements.

For year we have been pressing the Council to improve the situation, but with no success. Members raised the problem at the AGM, saying they wanted the committee to do something about it.

We contacted the Council on 4 April asking for a meeting with a senior officer. We have had no response apart from a formal acknowledgement.

So it is time for direct action.

On Sunday 14 May, led by a member dressed as a rodent, we will collect the rubbish bags on our streets and dump them on the steps of Brighton Town Hall.

Rat Run

Residents of Abbotts and neighbouring properties are becoming increasingly concerned about the condition of number 128 Kings Road.

This building occupies a prime site on the sea front but has been virtually derelict for several years. The conditions at the back of the building are quite disgusting.

In recent weeks rats have been seen on the site.

We are asking the Council asking what they can do to force the owner to improve the condition of the property. Action is needed now. This building has been a problem for too long.

More White Lines

We reported recently on the problems caused by traffic queues in Cannon Place. Residents in the Russell and Clarence Square areas have great

difficulty getting home by car because car park queues block the northbound side of Cannon Place.

We took this up with the Council. Traffic technician, Elaine Dignan has told us that to create a right turning lane into the car park it would be necessary to have a loading ban in Cannon Place.

The possibility of a traffic order to create a loading ban has been considered but rejected because of the need "to allow loading to service the adjacent buildings".

Instead, the Council plans to "re-position the centre line and mark some arrows on the road to encourage drivers to position their vehicles in such a way that a free flow of traffic is maintained." This will be done "as soon as possible".

Retrospective planning permission has been refused twice: once by local planners and then on appeal to the Secretary of State.

Talking about Parking

Residents in Brunswick and Palmeira Squares now have parking bays reserved for their use from 9am to 8pm, *seven days a week*.

Can we have the same? Maybe. The Council is looking at new parking arrangements for our area. There will be a public consultation next month. We should all get a leaflet with a questionnaire.

Seven day residents' bays are being seriously considered, though only until 7pm rather than 8. Other ideas include:

- vouchers that residents could buy to allow their visitors to use resident bays;
- pay and display to make it easier for people who don't know the town to pay for a space;
- loading bays outside hotels, possibly resulting in some loss of parking spaces;
- "decriminalised parking enforcement":- wardens work for the Council instead of the police.

We've been asking for improvements to parking for ages but it does look as if something is now going to happen.

Society committee member, Diana Dunn represents the Society on a forum set up by the Council to discuss these ideas.
