However, we object strongly to the large glass enclosure at the top of the square. It is entirely out of keeping with the architecture of the area. As the Council's own picture shows, it will obscure views of the fine listed buildings. It is also likely to attract fly posting.

We believe that the Council can find another solution.

Car park queues

We have had a further meeting with Councillor Ian Davey about the problems of tailbacks at the entrances to local car parks.

Our proposal to remove some parking spaces from the western side of Regency Square has been put into abeyance. The hope is that congestion near the car park entrance will be solved by the improvements the Council is planning for the car park. Our proposal will be reconsidered if the problem persists after the improvements are complete.

Council officers are investigating the feasibility of allowing local residents to access Russell and Clarence Squares and nearby streets via Western Road. This would avoid the problem of local drivers being caught in car park queues in Cannon Place.

Thank you Waitrose!

Our Society is to be included in the green token, fund raising scheme at the Waitrose store in Western Road. Funds raised will be used to pay for a new bench in Regency Square to commemorate the Queen's diamond jubilee.

Improvements in Preston Street

The Council will be making improvements in Preston Street to try to attract more visitors. There will be a "decluttering" exercise to rationalise signs etc. The cycle lane will be re-painted.

Street lighting may be changed from yellow to white. There is also talk of putting ornamental arches at each end of the street.

The proposed changes to traffic flows in the street described in recent newsletters are currently on hold, as are plans to level the sloping pavements.

Meanwhile, traders are asking for permission to close the street for a Diamond Jubilee party in June.

Better lighting for safer spaces

An additional street light is to be provided in the twitten between Regency and Russell Squares. The Society asked for this improvement following a late night attack in the twitten.

We are also talking to the Council about improvements to lighting in Russell Square and changes in all three local squares so that existing street lights also illuminate garden areas.

Muck raking in the square

By the time you read this, members of the gardening club will have taken delivery of a load of compost and dug it into the new bed in Regency Square.

A membrane will then be placed over the bed to protect it until planting starts around mid-March.

We are hoping to get some plants from the Council to fill gaps in the existing beds around the top garden.

New flats approved for Stone Street

We objected to the plan for new flats at 19 Stone Street because we thought the design was not in keeping with the rest of the street and that they were too high.

Permission has now been granted but the top floor has been set back to reduce the effect of the building's height. The shop front at 68 Western Road is also part of the scheme and will be fully restored to a high standard.
