

An accountant by trade, Roger served as Treasurer and did two stints as Chair the second for the last 12 years. But for 33 years Roger wrote all 269 Newsletters! Reporting all the news and views affecting our area and encouraging a love of the architecture of which we are all custodians, he has been instrumental in fostering a sense of community and neighbourliness.

Roger campaigned vigorously on issues that directly affect us including rubbish collection, noise nuisance to appropriate planning and banning dogs from the top garden in Regency Square.

Roger is well known and respected in the Council and has often been quoted in the Argus. His newsletters are archives of the Squares' history.

It is difficult to adequately express the appreciation that is felt for such dedication and hard work; Roger's are big boots to fill, but we wish him well and hope to continue the wonderful work he started.

THE PAVILION COMES ALIVE

I360 AND WEST PIER

The West Pier Trust are hoping to secure the rest of the funding needed to start the construction of the i360. Confirmation should be in the next month and we will keep you posted.

In the meantime Mike Holland has withdrawn his bid for the building of a new pier but another investor is interested: stay tuned.

The Rock Shop is to be dismantled and stored securely to prevent further deterioration until the i360 is built at which time it will be resurrected. The committee will be pursuing the tidying up of the site which has been boarded up and trying to find out more about the state of the boardwalk.
