43 RUSSELL SQUARE

The first planning application for the conversion of this family home into a house of multiple occupation has been turned down and a further application has been submitted for a basement flat and four flat lets one ensuite and 3 with communal bathroom.

It was brought to our attention by a neighbour in Russell Square that this is the last house in the row that is a family house. Despite the fact that the house was full of hand basins etc from the 50's to about the 1990's, the house has never been granted permission for multiple occupation which is what the owners are now applying for (http://www.brightonhove.gov.uk/indes.cfm?request+c1199915&act ion=showDetail&APPLICATION NUMBER= bh2012%F04036) It does seem such a shame, in a time of returning these listed houses back to their original use, that this is a retrograde step. The committee believe that single family houses should not be granted change of useage so will be objecting.
