Annual General Meeting

The Society's 34th AGM will be held at 7.30pm on Monday 18th March in the Osborne Room at the Hilton Metropole Hotel. We are delighted that Councillor Jason Kitkat, Leader of Brighton and Hove City Council, will start the evening with a talk on local concerns and then answer questions. This will be followed by the refreshment break. The formal business of the AGM will take place at 8.30, as set out in the agenda below.

The Committee's Annual Report

Car Park Improvement

Work started in April 2012 to upgrade the Regency Square Car Park. While the improved security will be welcome, nearby residents have had to put up with considerable inconvenience. We have the Council's assurance that the grass will be restored when the work is finished. The Council has now decided that the possibility of someone falling from the new car park entrance roof presents a health and safety risk. Discussions are ongoing as to how to address this problem. We are resisting the Council's idea of large warning signs.

The West Pier Site and the i360

In April, it seemed that the i360 was likely to go ahead, when the Council offered a loan to fill the funding gap. Work was due to start by the end of 2012. To date all that has happened is some token digging, and the site continues to deteriorate. The Rock Shop has been dismantled and stored. A large area at pavement level remains fenced off. If the i360 does go ahead, it seems likely that some funding will be available for landscaping in Regency Square.

Planning and Conservation

As always, reviewing planning applications and addressing conservation issues has been a major part of our activity over the year. Duncan Cameron has continued to attend the Conservation Advisory Group. An ongoing problem has been unauthorised work being carried out on 43 Russell Square and 67 Preston St. In both cases, sketchy planning applications have been submitted and work started prior consent being obtained. We have, along with the CAG, objected to the conversion of 43 Russell Square into 10 bedsits . We also objected to the enlargement of the Yacht Club building on the beach.

Duncan Cameron has taken a particular interest in Stone St and Castle St, which contain a number of interesting and significant historical buildings. The old stables in Stone St have been listed. Ongoing issues are the Council's plan to install communal recycling bins in our area (to date no decision has been reached), and the local listing review, under which submissions for new listings of buildings are invited.

Area Improvements

We have just received the Council go ahead to install a bench in memory of Ken Kennar, long term Russell Square resident. This will be funded mainly by Ken's family, with donations from neighbours and RSAS. The Regency Square Improvement Fund has been used to plant a new flower bed in the top lawn and additional shrubs and bulbs in the borders. Repairs were carried out on two benches and one new bench installed. The railings which appertain to the Regency Square car park are due to be repainted as part of the car park upgrade. Other railings are due to be painted black by residents from the West Pier Project hostel in Regency

The appearance of Preston St has been improved by attractive areas of granite blocks at each end of the street. A general tidying up of signage in Preston St is also underway.

The Regency Square Heritage board is being made up and will shortly be installed on the top lawn.

Traffic

Square.

We are monitoring the effects of the changes to the traffic flow in Regency Square and the new traffic lights by the Regency Restaurant. Cars can now turn right into and out of the south west corner of the Square instead of having to go via Preston St.

Congestion due to cars queueing to get into car parks continues to be a problem. We tried to obtain, for residents of Clarence and Russell Squares, access to the squares via the north west corner of Clarence Square. This was not, however, possible, as the cameras do not have number recognition.

Social Events

We had three very enjoyable theatre trips and two excellent dinners in Casalingo and Vino y Tapas. In June we had a wet but very musical picnic lunch in Regency Square to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Our usual pre Christmas drinks in the Regency Tavern and New Year's Day breakfast in the Regency Restaurant were well supported and good fun.

The West Laine?

Jason Kitkat has suggested promoting our area as a distinctive district of the city with its own character and has suggested *The West Laine* as a name. Jason has undertaken to convene a meeting of interested parties.

Treasurer's Report

While our General Fund income has increased this year (£1058 compared to £892), the surplus is slightly less (£240 as compared to £316), due mainly due to an increase in the insurance premium. We are currently holding monies for the bench in Russell Square and the heritage board. These funds will be closed shortly, when bench and board are installed. A new fund has been opened for signage following a donation of £100 for this purpose from M&M Tours. Our overall deficit is due to spending from the Regency Square Improvement Fund on the gardens. No increases in subscriptions are proposed.
