Planning

The City Council has served an enforcement order on 67 Preston Street. The list of detailed work which the Council wishes to be carried out by February 2015 is the longest list of any of the enforcement orders currently in force. The developers of 13 Stone Street/19 Castle Street have lodged and appeal against refusal to build a student residence in Stone Street. The Committee will object to the appeal on the ground of very poor design of the residence. It is a great pity that the excellent development of the old stables in Stone Street is inextricably linked to the plans for the student residence.

The City Council have refused permission for the new wood cladding on 80 Preston Street. The good news is that the owner seems amenable to removing the wood and improving the appearance of the restaurant.

Ride Down Memory Lane

Brighton and Hove Buses have introduced a seafront service from Brighton Station via to Palace Pier and on to the Kind Alfred Centre. Sadly this is only an hourly service and only in the summer ... but it is on a red 1965 Routemaster.
