#### THE POLICE PRECEPT

Sussex Police constantly tell the Society that their budget has been cut and that there are not enough PCSOs (let alone fully trained police officers) to deal with the antisocial behaviou in the city. Now is your chance to have your say to the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC, Katy Bourne).

In a recent message from the Neighbourood and Home Watch Network (NHWN), Sussex Police reminded the Society that the Sussex Police Precept Consultation is not yet closed and that:

"... if you have not yet expressed your views may we invite you to let the PCC know your thoughts?

This proposal is to increase the police element of council tax by around £5.00 per household to fund over 100 more police officers and specialist staff. The £5 is based on an average cost per household, p.a, based on a Council Tax Band D household, so depending on the household size and council tax band it could be more or less.


